Dear Parents/ Guardians,

To facilitate your planning, here is an update of our activities for Term Three 2018.

JUNE 2018

1) TEMPERATURE-TAKING EXERCISE

The school will be conducting the temperature-taking exercise on Thursday, 28 June 2018. The temperature-taking exercise serves to educate our pupils on the need to take personal responsibility of their own health and practice social responsibility.

We would like to seek your assistance in ensuring that your child brings his/her personal oral digital thermometer (ODT) to school on the above-mentioned dates. Pupils, who have misplaced their thermometers or have faulty thermometers, please purchase a thermometer available in most of the pharmacies and supermarkets. Alternatively, the thermometers can also be purchased at the school bookshop at \$3.00 each.

2) HARI RAYA CELEBRATION

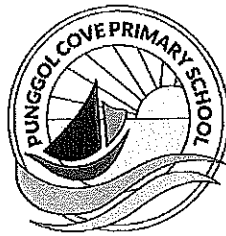

3) PRIMARY 2 PROGRAMME FOR ACTIVE LEARNING OUTDOOR EDUCATION LEARNING JOURNEY

All Primary 2 students will be going on a learning journey to Lorong Halus Wetland where they will participate in the Waterways Watch Explorer (WWE) programme. The students will get to learn about its unique features and how they can relate to our Singapore Water Story. There will be exciting and meaningful activities that deal with issues of climate change, water pollution and water sustainability. The learning journey will be conducted during curriculum time. 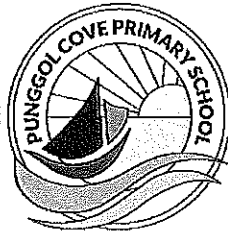

NAME TAGS

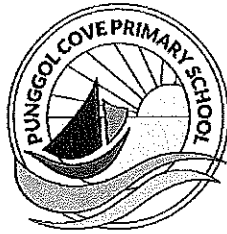
SCHOOL HOURS

All P1 pupils and P2/P3 pupils must report to the school canteen and school hall respectively in the morning by 7.30 a.m. sharp daily. We seek the cooperation of all parents to help us to instil in our pupils the value of punctuality. All pupils are encouraged to arrive in school at least 5 minutes before the reporting time to give themselves time to settle in and get ready for the day.

OPENING HOURS OF SCHOOL GATES

MAIN GATE A (School Vehicular Traffic Gate)	6.30 a.m. – 7.00 p.m.
GATE B (Side Gate beside Main Gate A)	6.50 a.m. – 8.15 a.m. 1.15 p.m. – 2.00 p.m.
GATE E (Side gate towards LRT Station)	3.45 p.m. – 5.00 p.m. (Thu & Fri) 6.00 p.m. – 7.00 p.m.

Please advise your child which gate you will be picking fetching him/her up from daily.



Main Gate A is for vehicles ONLY. Pupils and parents walking to school are advised to enter the school through Gate B or Gate E (LRT Gate) for safety reasons. Beyond the stipulated gates opening hours, pupils and parents are advised to exit the school from Main Gate A.

On rainy days, school buses will have the priority to park at the porch area. Drivers will be directed to drive into the school only after the school buses have left.

Drawing reference to the media advisory released by National Environment Agency (NEA) on 19 November 2014, to safeguard the public health for our pupils and our staff, parents are reminded to switch off your engines while waiting to pick your children from the school.

SAFETY OF YOUR CHILD AT SCHOOL ZONE

As you approach the school along Sumang Walk, you would have noticed the red-textured surface and "SCHOOL" markings on the roads outside our school. These road safety measures are part of the School Zone Scheme implemented by the Land Transport Authority (LTA) to improve road safety for all primary schools. This scheme highlights to motorists that they are approaching a primary school and should therefore take extra care, slow down, and be alert to look out for school children crossing the road.

If you drive your child to school, please drop off your child and allow him / her to walk towards the school hall / school canteen by himself / herself so as not to hold up the traffic at the drop off point. As you may encounter heavy traffic during school days especially between 7.15 am to 7.30 am as well as during dismissal time in the afternoon, we seek your understanding to exercise patience when you bring or fetch your child to and from school.

If you walk your child to school, please set a good example by crossing the road at the designated pedestrian crossings e.g. traffic lights and zebra crossings located outside the school and enter via Gate B or Gate E (LRT Gate).

If your child must cycle to school, please ensure that he knows safe cycling rules and is a competent cyclist.

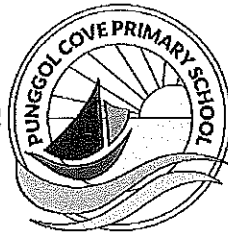

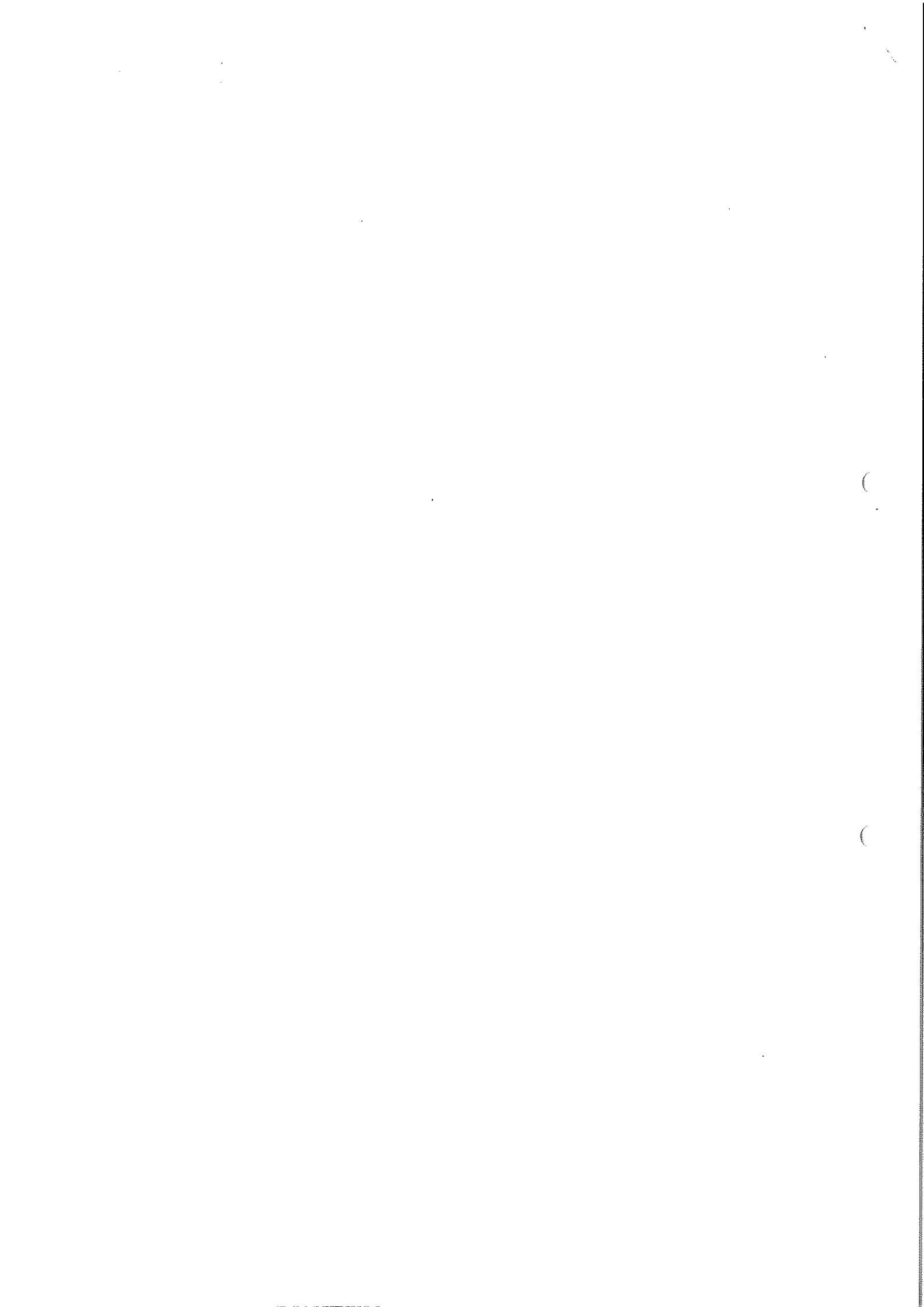
To assess the different learning outcomes, the school has developed a range of age-appropriate assessments to enable our pupils to demonstrate their acquired skills.

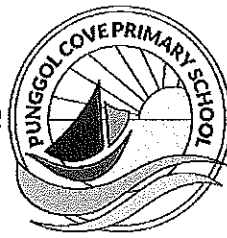
